
Amore Danza back in the stalls after her tie back surgery

After lurching sideways and nearly throwing jockey Jackson Murphy, all her momentum was lost after travelling beautifully on the rail. To her credit she regained her composure and finished off strong for 4th. Coolwedge has been in work for 260 days and after falling out the back in her last start it's time for her to take a well earnt break. From 6 starts this campaign, Dora has a win, a third, two fourths and a sixth and has pushed herself up over \$42000 in prizemoney.







TOOTHLESS GELDING WINS ON DEBUT

Sepoy gelding Indian Dreamer has kicked off his career in impressive style at the Sunshine Coast. Scratched late last Saturday on the Gold Coast after suffering some selfinflicted wounds which resulted in two teeth having to be extracted, Indian Dreamer has pulled off an impressive win in his first race start at Caloundra. After missing the start by three lengths the big gelding quickly caught and went around the field three and four wide before straightening and winning by a head. Pretty exciting stuff as the Edmonds team believe his best will be seen over 1350m to the mile.

COLT GETS A NAME AND HEADS BACK INTO WORK

The Choisir colt purchased at this year's Magic Millions sale has recently gone back into pre training at Fenwick Farm and is expected to be back into the Edmonds stables for more education in the coming weeks. Since the last edition he has been given the race name Dalbergia. As with most of Lucky Clover horses the owners are asked for name suggestions and the ownership group will then vote for the winner. Graeme Carey was the owner who suggested Dalbergia, there is a long story behind the name and if you ever run into Graeme be sure to ask him as it is very interesting how he thought it

RACE TYPES EXPLAINED

There's been a lot of questions about the different race types and classes so we thought we would try to make it easier for you.

MAIDEN – A race for a horse that's never won a race.

CLASS 1-6 – A class 1 race is for horses that have won 1
race only. Class races go up to class 6 which is for horses
that have won no more than 6 races. After a horse has won
6 races, they go into Open Class


BENCHMARK RACES (BM) – A benchmark race is open to all horses and is a handicap race designed to keep the playing field level. After a race a horse is assessed and given a numeric rating. This rating is based on performance and the opposition in previous races along with winning margins and weights carried. The Benchmark will carry a minimum weight and horses are weighted according to their rating. For example, a horse with a rating of 56 in a BM56 race will carry the minimum top weight. Horses with rating less than 56 will receive a .5kg weight relief for every point under and every point over 56 will receive .5kg weight gain. There is also 2kg relief given to fillies and mares when racing against the boys as well as some weight relief for the younger horses when racing against the older ones depending on the time of season. The rating and weights vary from state to state and race to race.

BLACK TYPE – These include Group 1 Group 2 Group 3 and Listed races. The term Black Type comes from the names of horses who win these races being in bold in the sales catalogues.

HANDICAP RACES – Similar to the Benchmark system but applied to open races with a minimum weight applied to the best rated horse in the race.

WEIGHT FOR AGE (WFA) – Weights are given to horses depending on their age, it's sex, the race distance and the month of the racing season. Most often in Group 1 races SET WEIGHTS WITH PENALTIES (SWP) – Similar to Weight for Age with weight penalties added if a horse has won certain races which can vary from race to race. Used mostly in age restricted races.
